

# Library Annual Report

## Fiscal Year 2024

### From the Library

In this FY24 annual report, I would like to report on the progress of the four annual goals at the PCOM Library:

Continuing development of library resources and services

- Ebook collection size increased to 578,243 titles (+4,244%)
- Journal collection size increased to 33,278 titles (+130%)
- Resource downloads increased to 402,802 (+29%)
- Institutional repository downloads increased to 271,452 (+18%)

Digitizing the PCOM historical collections

- Digitized over 300 video tapes, films, and photographs
- Added 271 faculty and student publications, archival files, and digital copies of the Journal of Integrated Healthcare to the Digital Commons

Modernizing the PCOM Library integrated system and website

- New integrated library system budget approved
- Internal system implementation preparation completed

Supporting student success at PCOM

- Library visits increased to 375,620 (+3%)
- Reference transactions increased to 2,631 (+18%)






